Bible Reading

This is a part of the Easter story after Jesus came back to life and appeared to some of his disciples. The disciples decided to go fishing and even though they fished all night they caught no fish. In the morning they saw someone on the beach who told them to 'Throw your net on the right side of the boat and you will catch some fish.'

So, they did and caught 153 fish – the net was so heavy they could hardly get it into the boat! Then they realised person on the beach was Jesus – Peter couldn't wait to see him so jumped over the side of the boat and swam towards him. Then Jesus cooked fish and bread for them over the fire he had made and they spent some time together. Jesus let Peter know that he had forgiven him for pretending not to know Jesus and told him 'follow me'.

What a wonderful story, but it also says in the Bible that there were so many other things that Jesus did there isn't enough room in the whole world to hold all the books it would take to write them in!

You can find this in the Bible, in the book of John, chapter 21, verse 1-25

Prayer

Dear God,

Creative Prayer 1 ≈ Flying fish!

Take a strip of paper roughly 10cm x 2cm(you can cut some out of scrap paper). Make a slit at on opposite ends of the strip—only cut halfway up the paper.

Write on it the name of a person or situation you want to pray for.

Fold the paper round and attach the ends at the slits, as shown in the photo so you have a fish shape.

Hold the fish high in the air and let it go—watch it spin through the air. As you do so pray for the people or situations you have named.



Creative Prayer 1 ≈ Saying sorry



It's good to say sorry and when we feel forgiven it can help us to make a new start. Is there anyone you need to say sorry to? Are there any ways you would like to make a new start, maybe after an argument with a friend? Maybe you can talk to God about these things and ask him to help you.

As a sign of saying sorry and a new start, take some old, stained 2p and 1p coins.

Put them in a plastic box with some vinegar and a teaspoon of salt. Put the lid on the box and shake for 30- 60 seconds. Open the box, pour the salt and vinegar mixture away and rinse the coins in water. How do the coins look? Sparkly and new? This also works if you cover the coin in tomato ketchup and leave them for a few minutes.

Put a coin somewhere it will remind you of the new start you are making with God's help.

Activity 1 ≈ Human Buckaroo!

Activity 2 ≈ Fish shaped food

Take something like an apple or orange and cut shapes and rearrange into a fish shape. Maybe you could shape potatoes before (or even after) they are cooked. Could you just arrange some vegetables on a plate? Be creative but make sure you are still able to eat the food and not waste it!
