Daily Prayer

This week we will be joining together with people across the whole world as we think about the special prayer Jesus taught us, which also our Bible reading for this week. We sometimes call it the Lord's Prayer. You can find this in the Bible in the book of Matthew, chapter 6, verses 9-14.

Our Father in Heaven

With other people in your household, spend some time outside, - maybe going for a walk — looking at the sky. If it's during the day, what do you imagine there to be beyond the clouds? If it's at night, what planet's or constellations can you spot? How does it make you feel when you see how big it looks? Remember that the God who made the heavens knows and loves each of us and that we are special to him. Spend some time just talking to God about anything that is on your mind.



Hallowed be your name

God's name is holy (set apart) and we are to treat it as something special. If you What words would you use to describe God? Maybe you would like to make a list starting with 'God is...' and write or draw what you think. You could do this activity all together maybe with lots of different pieces of paper or one big one! If you have chalk, you could do this outside in a space you have.



Your kingdom come, Your will be done on Earth as it is in Heaven

You might have read about a place called Narnia or seen it in a film. In that world, bad things sometimes happened that made Narnia seem broken but everything was put right in the end when Aslan the king came back. It's the same for us in our world. Are there any particular places or things happening in the world that you think need mending? Maybe they are things that seem unjust or unfair. Make a list of those things or cut some pictures out of newspapers or magazines to make a collage. What is your prayer for them? Is there anything you can do to help make the world a better place? It might be something that seems like a small thing such as remembering to show kindness to someone else, but that can make a **BIG** difference.



Give us today our daily bread

Our prayers can be like a sandwich, the slices of bread are the start and finish to our prayers — Dear God and Amen. What we say in the middle is our choice, just like choosing what goes in a sandwich. At different times we like different things, so our prayers to God can be different every time. We all like different fillings to each other, something you may love, someone else may dislike. In our prayers to God we should share what is important to us, for God knows what's in our hearts.



First take a slice of bread to start your sandwich and say, Dear God. Then choose the fillings you would like in your sandwich, each time you add a filling pray for something. You could thank God for all you are blessed with and for all that he provides. You could say sorry to God for the unkind things you may have said and done. You could ask for help with something or pray for someone you know who is struggling in some way, so that God would meet their needs too. Finish your pray by adding another slice of bread and saying—Amen.



If you unable to actually make a sandwich you could draw it. Writing your words on each item.

Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us

Imagine some bubbles blowing away— or if you have some you could blow them outside. As you do so, think about something you want to say sorry for and say sorry to God and as you imagine the bubbles floating away and popping remembering that God forgives you. Then, do this again but this time thinking for someone you want to forgive and as you imagine the bubbles popping ask God to help you forgive that person.



Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil

Take a cardboard tube, maybe a toilet roll or paper towel tube for just make one with some stiff card. You will need a marble or something similar—something small that might slide about. Set a cup at one side of a room (or use a space outside).

Stand at the other side of the room . Put the marble in the tube and see if you can transport to the other side of the room and tip it into the cup using only one hand. Everyone in the household could have a go. Maybe you could try it by each having a cardboard tube and passing it to one another but using one hand and without touching the marble or object.

How did you do? Was it tempting to use both hands? This is a fun activity but in life, It's not always easy to do the right thing especially if doing the wrong thing looks really tempting. If we ask him to, God can help us resist temptation.

Thank God that he is with us and that he helps us to follow the right path.

Take a strip of paper. Twist one end over . Bring the ends together and staple, glue or fasten with sticky tape. This makes and a loop that never ends— no beginning and no end. Just like God's love for you.
